

Following a career as a criminal defense attorney in San Francisco, Tammy returned to her hometown of Mill Valley to raise her newborn daughter. In the ensuing decades, Tammy has spearheaded a variety of local organizations and initiatives to support the arts, improve opportunities for youth, and protect the environment. She has also chaired and served on a variety of successful political campaigns related to these issues.

Tammy is a founding member of Marin's Community Arts Coalition whose research and advocacy spurred the development of a county-wide Arts and Culture Plan. As co-founder of Mill Valley's Community Arts Coalition, she previously led a successful community effort to develop and adopt comprehensive arts and culture goals as part of the city's General Plan. Tammy served for several years as president of the board at the Throckmorton Theatre, where she implemented strategic planning, operational, and development initiatives, to secure the future of the historic cultural hub.

Tammy currently serves on the Executive Committee of Marin Foster Care Association, helping to provide essential services, supplies, and support for Marin's most vulnerable population. She has chaired and served on a variety of councils, task forces, and committees, with and for the Mill Valley School District, aimed at improving educational opportunities in local public schools. In one such effort, she led a project to restore wetlands on school property through a four-year, multi-agency permitting process. The project culminated in the restoration of local tidal and seasonal wetlands, and launched a hands-on environmental education program where students help to monitor and maintain the sensitive habitats.

Tammy is a graduate of Hastings College of the Law, and San Francisco State University where she received her BA in Political Science. Her husband, Ethan Schulman, is a San Francisco Superior Court judge.
